The Poznań Croissant Museum and Experience is a living center of Poznań traditions and culture. This is a place for everyone who wants to get to know Poznań better, also its specificity, language and symbols, with particular emphasis to St. Martin's Croissants. Sightseeing has a form of an interactive show.

The museum's collections include a rich collection of clothing and accessories clothing from the 19th and 20th centuries. Among the exhibits there is also a significant number of technical monuments related to production clothes and their maintenance. Each outfit is a masterpiece artistic craftsmanship and extraordinary, but often a downplayed part of our culture and history.

At the Poznań Bamber Museum you can learn about the history of settlers from Bamberg (Germany) who came to Poznań in the 18th century and of the culture of the Greater Poland countryside. The exhibition presents Bamber's house from the 19th century, surrounded by a garden, equipped in the furniture, equipment and paintings that were there in the house of a wealthy Bamber farmer.

The museum tells the history of armored weapons in a compact and thoughtful way. The exhibits include mostly originals tanks, tractors and armored cars from the fronts from all over the world. In each of the pavilions we will find something special such as Steven Spielberg's autograph on the tank T-55, which played an episode in his film.

28 Invisible Street

A museum dedicated to the history of "pyra", as potatoes are known in the Poznań area. Potato is a very interesting vegetable and the fourth largest crop in the world. At the museum, you can learn about the history of this vegetable, different potato varieties, try your hand at digging, and even make your own edible potato.

Enea Stadium is the place where Lech Poznań football team trains and plays its matches. During the tour you can see, among other things, the players' locker room, walk through the tunnel, where they wait for the meeting to start and sit down substitutes benches. In the Museum you can learn more about history of the club, as well as admire the trophies won by Lech and other souvenirs.

There are three models in the basement of the Franciscan church: a model of old Poznań, showing Poznań as presented in Braun-Hogenberg's engraving from 1618, a model of the Castle The first Piast dynasty and a model of the Old Market Square. The mockups are animated using light, sound and special effects.

The Invisible Street is an unusual center for the senses, where there is an interactive exhibition placed in the dark where blind or visually impaired people act as guides. Such darkness as it was created on the Invisible Street, seers cannot experience every day.

At the Chocolate Museum you will learn everything about the history of cocoa and chocolate, its cultivation and its way to Europe, as well as get acquainted with packaging and objects related to the history of chocolate. During the tour you can try real chocolates and see how Belgian chocolates are made. A visit with a workshop on making your own chocolate bar lasts approximately 50 minutes.



The permanent exhibition of the museum presents pharmacy vessels made of wood, white and colored glass, stoneware and porcelain, the oldest from the end of the 17th century and pharmacy equipment from the 19th and 20th centuries. A significant part of the exhibits is presented in the historic dispensation chamber from the turn of the 19th and 20th century, moved from Miłostaw near Września.

A place where illusion meets science and art, giving the opportunity to experience a previously unknown world. Thanks to interactive attractions — from classic puzzles, through optical illusions, to large-format exhibits, the museum encourages learning through play. And whenever questions arise, the educator who accompanies each visitor will be happy to answer them.

1 Town Hall – Poznań Museum

Tue.–Wed. 10am–4pm

The town hall was built at the turn of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the mid-16th century, the building was rebuilt and acquired a uniform Renaissance external shape and a new interior layout with an impressive Renaissance Hall. Currently, the Gothic cellars and the ground floor of the building are available to guests – the result of the first stage of renovation of the Town Hall. You can see a new exhibition presenting the history of Poznań from the 10th to the mid-15th century, as well as learn about the history of the Town Hall.

3 Museum of Applied Arts in the Royal Castle in Poznań

The museum is located on Przemysł Hill. From the high, 43-meter high castle tower, there is a unique view of the city and the surrounding area. The museum presents applied art from the Middle Ages to the present day. It consists of furniture, ceramics, glass and metal products, weapons, jewelry, fabrics, clothes and accessories. On the ground floor there is a separate space dedicated to Przemysł II and the history of the Castle.

5 Museum of World Cultures

The museum is housed in a beautifully decorated building of a former Masonic lodge, once regarded as one of the most impressive lodge buildings in Europe. Today, it contains a fascinating collection of historical and contemporary objects – everyday and ceremonial items, work tools, objects of worship, and works of art. In total, the collection comprises over 17,000 objects and several thousand items of ethnographic source documentation.

6 Greater Poland Military Museum

The permanent exhibition of the museum is devoted to the history of Polish weapons and includes: melee weapons, firearms, protective equipment, military signs, uniforms and equipment from the 10th to the 21st century. It is decorated with battle paintings (including a fragment of the panorama „The Battle of the Pyramids” by Wojciech Kossak from 1901). The pride of the collection is a type of armor from 1580, decorated with the coat of arms of the city of Poznań on the backplate.


10 Enigma Cipher Centre

The Enigma Cipher Centre tells the story of breaking the code of the German Enigma cipher machine, which had its origins in Poznań. The multimedia exhibition tells, among others: about the art of encryption and coding, and how the discoveries of brilliant Polish mathematicians influenced the fate of World War II and the construction of the digital world. The tour takes place using an audio guide.

11 Museum of Greater Poland Uprising of 1918-1919

The museum is located in Fort VII – Colomb, which during World War II became the first German concentration camp in Poland. It documents the martyrdom of Greater Poland's people and collects all kinds of exhibits from this period. At the same time, it is the best-preserved structure of the outer ring of Prussian fortifications from the 19th century.

The Armament Museum is located in the Citadel, i.e. the former Winiary Fort built by the Prussian authorities in 1828–1842. The original interior of the former shelter is an ideal background for the presentation of military items. The biggest attraction of the permanent exhibition here is the outdoor military equipment park.

15 Museum of the Poznań Uprising of June 1956 in Poznań

The museum is located on the ground floor of the Imperial Castle and presents the history of the first mass workers' demonstration in the history of the Polish People's Republic. The running next to it Red Army Street (today Saint Martin) and the adjacent so-called Stalin Square (today Adam Mickiewicz Square) was the site of a protest by demonstrators on June 28, 1956.

The only real obelisk from ancient Egypt in Poland, tools used several thousand years ago by the first inhabitants of today's Greater Poland, face-shaped burial urns – these are just some of the extraordinary monuments that can be seen in the Archaeological Museum in Poznań. The seat of the museum is the Górk Palace, built in the 16th century.

The exhibition also includes a collection of modern religious paintings and sculptures, furniture and household items, and paintings and drawings by Leon Wyczółkowski.


12 Museum of Greater Poland Martyrs – Fort VII

The museum is located in the Guardhouse, i.e. the building of the former city guard. Visitors to the exhibition can trace the over 100-year path of Greater Poland's people to regaining independence, from participation in the Polish national uprisings of 1794–1864, through the idea of „organic work” and the war experiences of the Great War (1914–1918), to the victorious Greater Poland Uprising of 1918–1919.


14 Museum of the 'Poznań' Army

The museum collects exhibits related to the history of the Polish Army in the interwar period, with particular emphasis on units from Greater Poland. Its collections include iconographic materials, documents, banners, weapons, uniforms and many other historical memorabilia. What deserves special mention is the rich collection of photos showing everyday life and service in the garrisons of Greater Poland.

Declassified only in 2000, a former nuclear shelter for the mayor of Poznań and the highest city officials. The place is unique because of its history and purpose, but also because it turned out to be a real time capsule. Inside the shelter, the original equipment from the times of the Polish People's Republic has been preserved intact: from air units and filters, through furniture and maps, to bathroom fittings, telephones, radio, and... the president's sofa bed.
